Tier and Exam Board

 - Two papers, 2 hours 15 minutes each
 - Paper 1 – Non-calculator (Thursday 16th May)
 - Paper 2 – Calculator (Monday 3rd June)
- Higher – Edexcel
 - Three papers 1 hours 30 minutes each
 - Paper 1 – Non-calculator (Thursday 16th May)
 - Paper 2 & 3 – Calculator (Monday 3rd June and Monday 10th June)

In some cases, decisions about a student's tier of entry will be made as we approach the final exam. We always make decision based upon where we feel a student is likely to achieve their best grade.

- Aim for the marks you want for your GCSE!

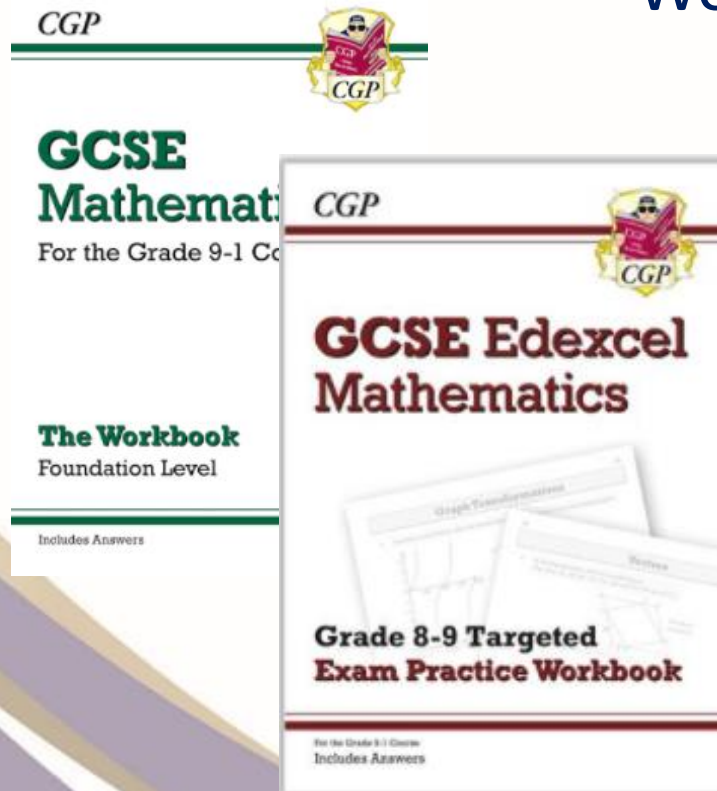
For example, if you're going for a 4, you'll need a 55 out of 120, and if you're aiming for a 7 – aim for 46 out of 80!

- Mix up topics, don't spend extended periods on the same topic

- Don't

Techniques which are proven not to be effective

- Copying from the textbook
- Highlighting

General misconceptions

- Quantity is not a replacement for quality
- Pretty notes aren't always good notes
- Spending more time isn't always better (see interleaving)
- If something is difficult, that means it is working! Take a break and then come back to it

Tips

- Don't just revise the topics you are most confident with, although it is tempting

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English Language - Overview

Remember both English Literature and Language are now assessed through **terminal exams only**. There is no Controlled Assessment or Coursework element

- 2 exams
- No tiers of entry
- Paper 1 - Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing – 1hr 45 mins – 80 marks – 50% weighting
- Paper 2 - 1 hr 45 – Exploration of Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives – 1hr 45 mins – 80 marks – 50% weighting
- Non-examination assessment: Spoken Language (S&L) separate endorsement- 0% weighting (Completed in Year 10)



English Literature - Overview

- 2 exams
- No tiers of entry
- Paper 1 - Shakespeare and 19th Century novel – 1hr 45 mins – 64 marks – 40% weighting
- Paper 2 - Modern Texts and Poetry – 2hr 15 mins – 96 marks – 60% weighting



How to maximise your grades in GCSE English

Use these ideas for revising at home, as well as attending clinics and any additional interventions

Ideas to revise GCSE English Language

1. **PRIVATE READING:** Read quality fiction / non-fiction every day (or as often as you can). Access SORA via the Student Sharepoint for thousands of eBooks, graphic novels, and audiobooks.
2. **PRACTICE CREATIVE AND TRANSACTIONAL WRITING:** Practice responding to pictures (Google "writing prompt pictures") and writing letters, articles etc., to help respond to the Question 5 section of the Language papers.
3. **COMPLETE ADDITIONAL PAST PAPERS:** available on the Student SharePoint / AQA Website
4. **SOCIAL MEDIA:** Follow reputable feeds such as 'bbcnewsround' / 'bbcnewsbeat' or 'bbcnews', and accounts like 'SimplePolitics', 'earthlyeducation'. You can also follow inspirational people such as 'gretathunberg', Marcus Rashford, Akala, Dan Snow.
5. **YOUTUBE TUTORIALS:** Watch videos by YouTubers such as Mr Bruff, who analyse the questions taught in the AQA Specification.
6. **FLASHCARDS:** Create flashcards for terminology and the question structures of AQA Language.
7. **BBC BITESIZE:** Complete activities at <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/examspecs/zcbchv4>

Ideas to revise GCSE English Literature

1. **READING:** Re-read the 3 set texts you have studied and the 15 poems ('Lord of the Flies', 'Jekyll and Hyde', 'Macbeth', 'Power and Conflict'). These can be accessed via the Henry Beaufort E-Library. Audio books also available. Read a variety of poetry – subscribe to Poetry Foundation newsletter to receive 1 poem a day.
2. **SENECA:** Continue with your revision using the online quizzes for each text <https://www.senecalearning.com/>
3. **BBC BITESIZE:** Complete activities relevant to the texts you have studied at: <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/examspecs/zxqncwx>
4. **WATCH** the film versions (Netflix, You Tube, other services) of the texts you have studied.
5. **YOUTUBE TUTORIALS:** Watch videos by YouTubers such as Mr Bruff, BBC Teach, Comics and Lit, Mr Everything English, RSC Shakespeare Learning Zone to help revise all texts, including poetry.
6. **COMPLETE ADDITIONAL PAST PAPERS and KNOWLEGDE ORGANISER QUIZZES:** available on the Student SharePoint / AQA Website
7. **FLASHCARDS:** Create flashcards for key quotes, characters, plot points, themes.
8. **READ ONLINE CRITICISM SITES:** such as SparkNotes <http://www.sparknotes.com>
